

What program should I apply for?

We have a range of [programs](#) that are offered throughout the year. This gives you the freedom to apply for the program that suits your level of training and career decision-making process. When should I apply?

Do you offer work experience?

We run several work experience programs.

- For first, second and third year Law students we offer our [Dive In](#) program.
- Our [Indigenous Internship](#) is open to first, second and third year Law students of Aboriginal and Torres Strait Islander descent.
- Penultimate year law students can apply to complete a [clerkship](#).

Unfortunately, we can't offer work experience outside these programs.

What grade point average do I need to apply?

We take a holistic approach to your application, and don't screen out on grades alone. We are however, generally looking for a credit average or above. If you have mitigating circumstances, these will be taken into consideration. Find out what it's like to [work here](#) on the website.

I wasn't invited for an interview. Can I have feedback on my application?

We're afraid not. We receive a large number of applications per academic year, which makes it impossible to provide individual application feedback.

I have been for an interview, when will I hear the outcome?

We will notify you with the outcome of your interview according to the Law Society guidelines in your state. If you have applied in Sydney and completed your first round interview, we will come back to you within 10 working days to confirm whether you will progress to a second round interview. Following that, we will update you according to the New South Wales Law Society guidelines.
